Congratulations to Wishesland Kuching and its founder, Mr Chi Peh Yung, for opening your 1st branch of Wishesland in Miri, Sarawak. I am truly amazed by your spirit and determination to extend your charitable services to Northern Sarawak.

I am pleased to see the Sarawak government has allocated a place at Plasau Camp, Miri, as Wishesland Miri's operation centre. The Sarawak government will continue to support NGOs in Sarawak so that they can become our strategic partners in addressing various social problems in society.

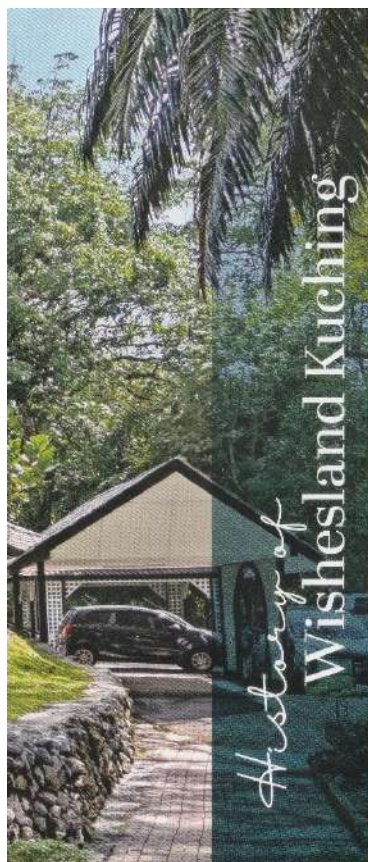

Setting up this cerebral palsy society was mooted 13 years ago by a group of parents whose children were diagnosed with cerebral palsy. They attended a talk organised by Pastor Mok Ing Huat on 20.7.2007 in MBKS Hall in Kuching, Sarawak, Malaysia. The pastor shared his latest book on his experiences taking care of his cerebral palsy son overseas and in Malaysia.

After the sharing session ended, Pastor Mok and a few parents stayed back and started a heart-to-heart chat regarding their own challenges, obstacles, and problems, including the sad and happy moments they had gone through with their cerebral palsy children.

From that group chat, they all agreed that more such sharing sessions should be carried out so that the activity could serve as a platform for parents to exchange ideas, share feelings, and get new treatment information on how to improve their children's condition. As a few more parents' sharing sessions were later followed through at various locations in Kuching, they saw more and more parents turning up for each session.

As there was no formal NGO in Kuching or East Malaysia where parents could go for counselling or get information about cerebral palsy, these parents felt an imperative need for a formal organisation or centre to be set up so that a more structured and professional organisation of information about cerebral palsy and treatment programmes could be planned and effectively executed.

With that in mind, a protem committee was formed

in 2008, with Pastor Mok as its protem committee president. The committee then started to look for the necessary information on setting up the association.

However, due to the busy schedule and heavy commitment of Pastor Mok at his church, he decided to step down as the Protem Committee President. The process of setting up the association was thus left in limbo for a while.

Things went again when Mr Chi Poh Yung took the leadership to continue the quest in early 2009.

Setting up the association met a turning point when Sarawak Convention Bureau injected a setup fund of RM5,000 for the Protem Committee to engage a consultant to work out a plan. The initial name of the proposed association was Kuching & Samarahan Division Cerebral Palsy Association. Registration of the association was approved by the Registrar of Society on 2nd April 2009; it took less than 3 months from the application date.

The association's philosophy is that all members must cultivate a positive and hopeful attitude regardless of how challenging things would be when handling the process of nurturing and healing children with cerebral palsy.

Thus, to reflect that theme, the committee decided to change the association's name to WisheLand to reflect that the place is the land for parents to gather and fulfil their wishes or hopes for their children. The name change was approved by the Registrar of Society on 1st October 2009.





The idea of setting up Wishesland Miri was brought up by Madam Katharine Chai to Mr Chi Poh Yung, the founder cum president of Wishesland Kuching in July 2020. She expressed that there is a need to unite all the cerebral palsy children and adults in Miri under one organization so that they could receive the best welfare and treatment support just like in Kuching.

After listening to the explanation of Madam Katharine Chai, Mr Chi informed her that he will bring her proposal to Wishesland Kuching Board Member for discussion. After much consideration, Wishesland Kuching Board Member unanimously agreed to set up Wishesland's 1st branch in Miri, Sarawak for the benefits of cerebral palsy children and adults in northern Sarawak.

As a start, Madam Katharine Chai together with other volunteers paid a courtesy visit to several OKU centres in Miri such as PPDK Mosjaya, Sunflower Centre Miri, PPDK Batu Niah, etc. With the help of Madam Roslind and Madam Margaret whom are parents with

cerebral palsy children, we managed to meet up with some parents with cerebral palsy children and adults with cerebral palsy in Miri. We informed them of our intention to set up Wishesland Miri and they all are very happy and supportive with our proposal.

Wishesland Kuching is well known in the cerebral palsy community in Miri. However, due to the distance and other unforeseen reasons, parents could not send their children to Kuching for consultation and treatment, hence, they are so excited when they heard that Wishesland is going to set up its branch in Miri.

In order to give cerebral palsy community in Miri a better understanding on what is Wishesland, a series of communication sessions between parents and Mr Chi from Wishesland Kuching were held through zoom. The first session was held at PPDK Mosjaya on 4.9.2020.

With the guidance of Mr Chi and under compliance of Covid 19 SOP, we have successfully organised our very first family gathering on 17.9.2020 at one of

our parents' houses. On 10.10.2020, a family day was organized at Ocean Park Miri basketball court with overwhelming response from parents and adults with cerebral palsy. After the event, we have successfully gathered enough numbers of protem committee members to form Wishesland Miri.

Our first protem committee members meeting was held on 17.10.2020 through Zoom. After the meeting, we proceeded to prepare all the necessary documentation before we submit to Registrar of Society (ROS) Miri for approval. Our application was then approved by ROS on 21.12.2020. Wishesland Miri's 1st Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held on 23.1.2021 via Zoom with 29 members attended.

The next step we need to take is to find a place we called home for children and adults with cerebral palsy where they could undergo quality treatment and rehabilitation. Hence, we paid a courtesy visit to the Resident Office of Miri and they advised us to apply to Sarawak government for an ex-Shell quarter located at Piasau Camp Miri as

our operation Centre. We then wrote in a letter to Sarawak government and our application was approved in June 2021.

Immediately after we are granted with the quarter, we quickly called for a committee meeting to discuss on the renovation of the building and other preparation works. As public donation is prohibited due to pandemic, we have sought help from local newspapers, radio station, assemblymen and member of parliament to assist us in raising fund for renovation.

With strong support from Mirian and wide coverage of local social and printed media in Miri, we managed to collect enough fund for renovation within a month. Our renovation works have started in October 2021 with first stage of renovation works were completed in December 2021.

Wishesland Miri has its soft launching on 28.12.2021 with 1 caretaker, 2 physiotherapists and 20 cerebral palsy children registered for various treatment programmes.



Objectives

1. To unite children and adults with cerebral palsy as well as members of their families under one organisation to strengthen social coordination;
2. To provide an avenue for counselling services, rehabilitation and consolidated treatment to cerebral palsy children or adults with the close cooperation and involvement of members of their families;
3. To accept donations from public members or patrons to sustain and promote the propagation of the objectives and aspirations of the association;
4. To contribute welfare support and assistance to children or adults with cerebral palsy and to ensure that their interests and rights are recognised and protected;
5. To foster a closer relationship, goodwill, and harmony among members of the association;
6. To raise funds for the association with prior consent from the Registrar of Societies and relevant authorities and having been approved in the association's General Meeting.

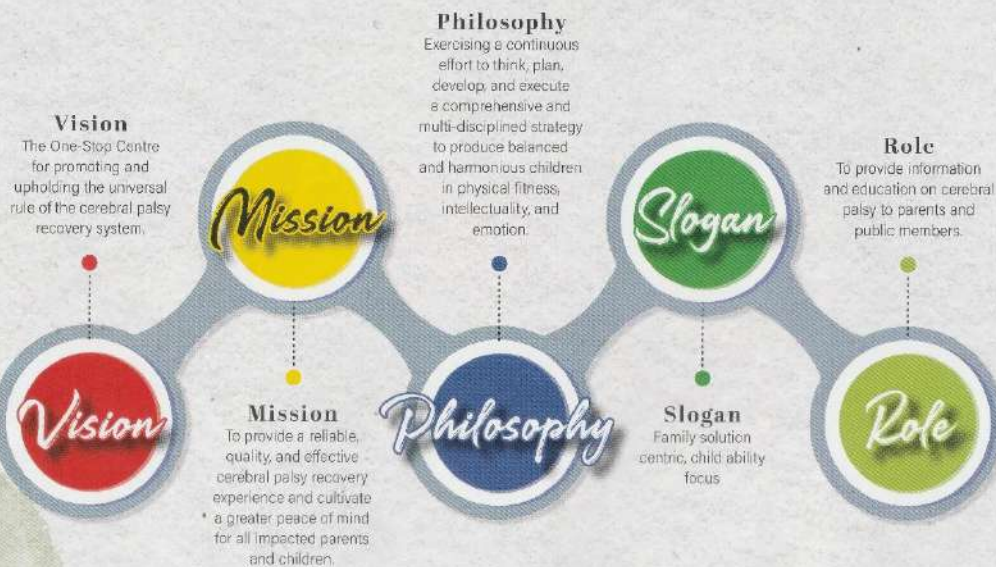
The Meaning

Overall, the logo resembles a beautiful flower that depicts the hopes and desires of people with cerebral palsy to live despite the challenges and obstacles they may face in life.

The heart-shaped blossom symbolises the power of love, a love of the kind that people with cerebral palsy need most from everyone.

The four leaves supporting the love symbol denote the spirit of perseverance and determination in overcoming life's challenges and obstacles, and all these must start from a green young age. Green is also the colour of sustainable energy, symbolising that the spirit of charity lives in everyone from all walks of life regardless of race, religion, and stature. They all will not cease their continuous support for the association.

The bigger, blue, round spot placed higher than the smaller yellow one represents a more able person obligated to provide shelter, guidance, and protection to the less able person who needs all the help they need.

In 2020, my wife and I brought my Cerebral Palsy son to an event that gathers all the cerebral palsy children and adults together. At this event, I met the event organiser, Mdm Katherine Chai. She told me that she intended to form an organisation mainly for Cerebral Palsy children and adults. The idea came from WisheLand Kuching, which was established 13 years ago.

She assured me that WisheLand Kuching would provide full support and backup. On top of that, Mdm Katherine Chai invited me as one of their protem committee members. Once she explained WisheLand's objectives and philosophy on helping Cerebral Palsy Children wholeheartedly, I was touched by her passion and agreed to help her.

WishesLand Miri started from zero. After she gathered all the protem committee members, we began registering with ROS. Then, we found a suitable building as our operating centre and published it in local newspapers to inform the public about the existence of WisheLand Miri and raised some funds.

Thanks to Sarawak Government for granting WisheLand Miri the ex-shell quarters at Piasau Camp as our operation Centre in June 2021, which was also the most crucial moment. As the building had been neglected for more than ten years, it was just an empty house with no doors, no windows, and no electricity supply. The surrounding compound was also full of bushes, so we needed a lot of funds to do renovations and clear the area. Unfortunately, we could not call for any fund-raising activities due to the pandemic. However, we are very

grateful that we have plenty of kind people in Miri. With their help, WisheLand Miri could complete all the renovations in the shortest period of time and has been operating since 28th December 2021.

The existence of WisheLand Miri brings hope to Cerebral Palsy children's parents and adults. With the help of professional and well-trained staff, our children's condition becomes better and better day after day. However, although WisheLand Miri is a non-profit organisation, it only collects a minimum monthly treatment fee. In addition, it waives the treatment fee for low-income families. Therefore, I hope WisheLand Miri could continue to obtain support in terms of funds or kinds from the organisation and the public sector.

I wish WisheLand Miri will continue to grow and help more cerebral palsy children and adults in Miri.

Soft Launching

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As a new establishment specifically aimed at taking care of cerebral palsy children in Miri, many activities need to be carried out to create awareness of our existence, including the types of services or counselling we can provide for these special children.

From 2020 until 2022, we have carried out visitation trips to local PPDs Community Based Rehabilitation Centre paying home visits to cerebral palsy families to introduce WisheLand Miri. In addition, our committee also pays a visit to WisheLand Kuching to familiarise ourselves with the whole process of operations.

Dialogues between WisheLand Miri and local PPDs, cerebral palsy children's parents and adults have also been held to share, learn, and understand the habitude and needs of cerebral palsy children and adults. Parents of cerebral palsy children and adults could thus rest assured that WisheLand Miri could meet their needs if they visit us.

WisheLand Miri's Committee Members have learned much from PPDs and WisheLand Kuching on how

Equipment and Facilities



Some basic equipment is essential for the therapeutic treatment of cerebral palsy children if any healing programmes are to be carried out effectively. Wisheland Miri is fortunate enough to have many caring people or corporate entities in Miri that had come forward to donate either cash or equipment right from the time, even when it was newly set up.

The latest inclusion of facility is a hydrotherapy pool named WishFun Pool. It provides our children with a more conducive environment to practise their motor skills under the condition that water would lessen their physical burden. This is especially useful for learning finer motor skills.

Next in the pipeline is the creation of a Wishes Magick Garden. For this project, we will make the optimum use of the availability of green scenery and beautiful landscape around and in our compound to build the first-ever healing garden in Miri Sarawak, if not Malaysia. Wishes Magick Garden will have 3 zones: (1) Wishes Welcoming and Social zone, (2) Wishes Active Play zone, and (3) Wishes Meditation and Aromatherapy zone.

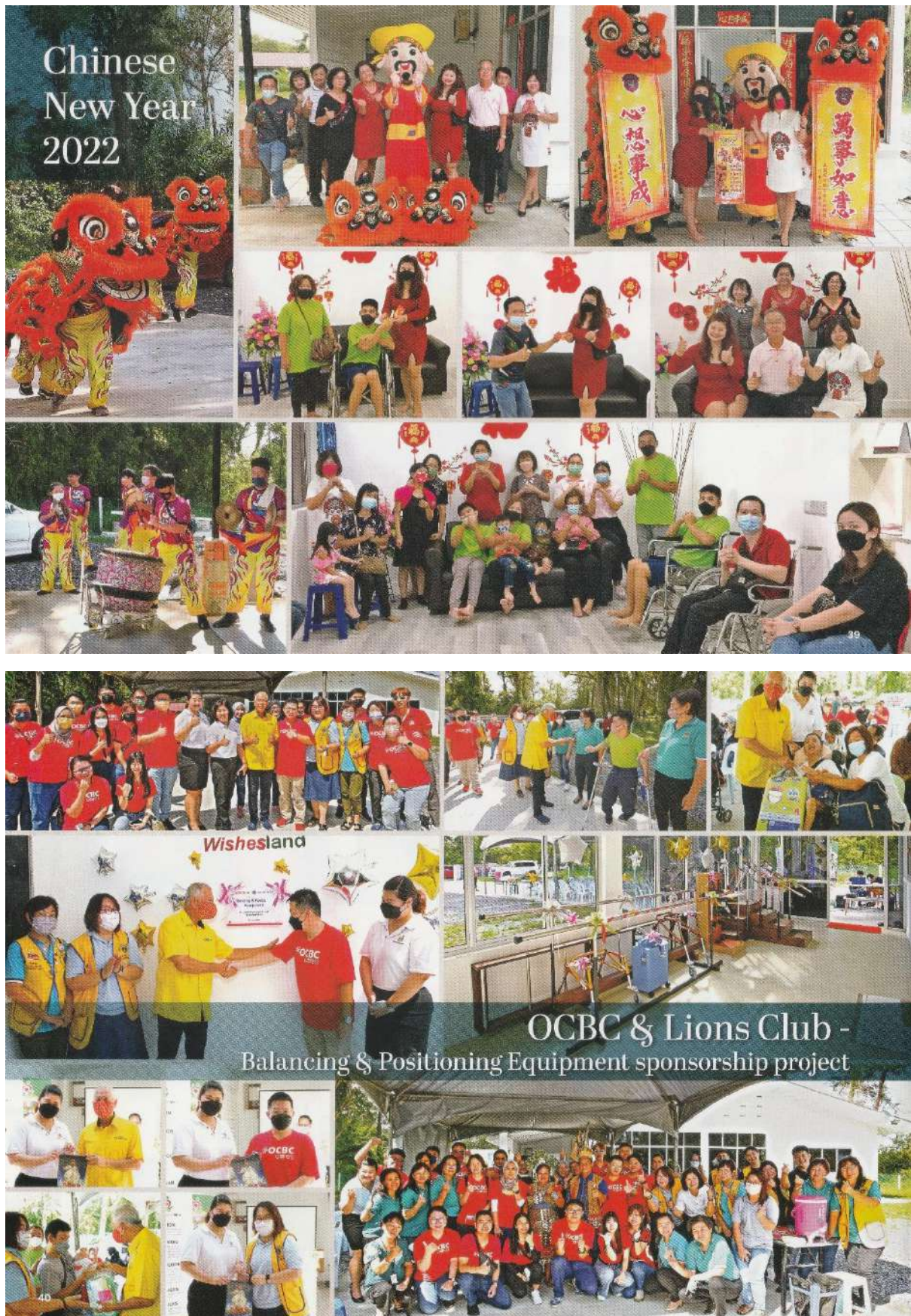

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Wisheslanders

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Gotong-Royong

Wishesland Miri has a vast compound which requires a lot of maintenance and upgrading works to make everything conducive to the children to improve their wellbeing or recovery.

Those many volunteers who carry out "gotong-royong" (work parties) have made the compound and environment of Wishesland Miri much cleaner, neater, and more beautiful so that it has become a wonderful place for the children and their families to mingle around.





What is Cerebral Palsy?

Cerebral palsy or CP is a disorder of movements and postures due to damage to or failure to develop normally in a small part of the brain controlling these activities. As a result, the brain cannot send proper signals to the muscles, affecting gait and other movements. Sometimes children and adults with CP also have learning difficulties or problems with sensory abilities such as hearing and sight.

CP is non-progressive, meaning that it does not get worse over time. Therefore, CP is not a disease and is certainly not caught.

CP can take many forms. Some people are so lightly affected that they appear to have no obvious disabilities. Meanwhile, others may be clumsy in their gait, which can affect one or both sides of the body or only both lower limbs, which is more common in children born prematurely, or they may have difficulty with their hands or muscles in speech, chewing and swallowing. Some individuals with more severe forms of CP cannot stand or sit and may require wheelchairs or special equipment.

CP often occurs before birth or sometime during delivery. A child with CP is estimated to be born once in 500 live births, without distinction of sex, race, maternal age or social background. CP

can also occur during the early years of a child's development as the result of brain damage in the first few months or years of life, brain infections such as bacterial meningitis or viral encephalitis, or head injury from a motor vehicle accident, a fall, or child abuse. Unfortunately, the cause in about a quarter of CP patients remains unknown even in today's medical practice.

CP is not curable, but it is treatable. The course of treatment depends on the CP type; the severity of symptoms and at what stage treatment is initiated. Treatment includes physical therapy to develop stronger muscles, occupational therapy (helping participants develop fine motor skills for specific tasks such as dressing, feeding and writing), and speech-language therapy, which focuses on developing communication skills and chewing and swallowing techniques.

Surgery, medication, orthotic devices (such as braces), communication devices (such as printed communication cards and boards) and computer technology are also widely used in treatments.

Alternative therapies such as acupuncture have also shown some promise in treating symptoms of CP. Still, it depends on the type of CP; the severity of symptoms and how early treatment is initiated.

TYPES OF CEREBRAL PALSY



Quadriplegia
All four limbs are involved.



Diplegia
All four limbs are involved. Both legs are more severely affected than the arms.



Hemiplegia
One side of the body is affected. The arm is usually more involved than the leg.



Triplegia
Three limbs are involved, usually both arms and a leg.



Monoplegia
Only one limb is affected, usually an arm.



Assessment

Overview

Step 1

Parents will be interviewed to understand the existing programmes that their children are doing and their hopes and aspirations.

Step 2

Children will be assessed on their abilities and challenges via a milestone chart.

- Evaluate children's 5 senses.
- Optional: House visits (once or every few months if necessary)

Step 3

Keep relevant records such as medical history and photographs of the children for future reference.

Three Months Review

Re-assessment every 3 months is needed so that parents can give us feedback regarding their children's latest progress. If the programme needs to be changed, a new one will be drawn to cater to the child's development stage.

Programmes

A balanced emphasis between parents and children is our core focus, direction and consideration when setting up programmes for Wishesland. Besides focusing on treating our children, we believe it is equally important to have a series of programmes drawn up to give our parents the necessary training, mindset, tools set, knowledge and competencies to grow with their children.

We also strongly believe that there is more than one technique that our cerebral palsy children can be used to achieve recovery. Hence, we welcome all parties with a relevant, proven record of treating cerebral palsy children to come and share with our parents. Finally, it is important to reckon that every child with cerebral palsy is unique because each individual has their own challenges, strengths and abilities.

There are 6 zones available in Wishesland, namely (1) WishesPhysio zone for children to do physiotherapy, (2) WishesADL zone for children to learn living skills, (3) WishesABC zone for children to learn academic knowledge, (4) WishesPlay zone for children to play with physiotherapy equipment and get the required results, (5) WishesFun Pool zone for children to undergo hydrotherapy and (6) Wishes Magick Garden zone for children to be attached with nature healing force.

All children are encouraged to go through these zones during their 2-3 hours treatment session so that all aspects of recovery processes would be experienced.

Hydrotherapy is a water-based physiotherapy programme, also known as Aquatic Physiotherapy. It is a specific form of physiotherapy treatment conducted in a heated pool. Aquatic Physiotherapy treatment (individually or in groups) incorporates individual assessment, diagnosis and clinical reasoning skills to formulate a treatment program appropriate to each child's needs. By combining hands-on pool-based physiotherapy and specifically designed exercises supervised by physiotherapists with specific training in Aquatic Physiotherapy, hydrotherapy helps regain or enhance physical wellbeing in a warm relaxing environment.

A series of gentle therapeutic exercises (distinct from swimming or aqua-aerobics) carried out in a heated pool allows greater comfort and range of movements as water can support body weight. In addition, therapeutic exercises can be progressed safely using the mellifluous water resistance to strengthen the muscles and improve stability.

As a part of normal development, a child continually moves his arms and legs, exercising as he learns to roll, crawl, move through sitting positions and walk. However, this spontaneous exercise is often limited in children with cerebral palsy. They may only be capable of a few movements and relatively inactive

compared with other children, limiting their amount of spontaneous exercise.

Exercise is very important for children with cerebral palsy. Exercise is an activity involving repeated body movements aimed at improving or maintaining a level of physical fitness. In children with cerebral palsy, exercise strengthens muscles, increases flexibility, improves respiratory function, enhances gross motor function, and, above all, has fun.

Swimming is a great way to encourage a child to exercise, have fun and gain confidence in the water. Water exercise is very appealing to all children.

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It gives the cerebral palsy children freedom of movement that they may not otherwise have on land. If a child has significant movement limitations, doing the land-based exercise may be limited.

Water buoyancy reduces the effects of gravity, poor balance and poor postural control. In addition, it provides postural support, allowing children with cerebral palsy to exercise with more freedom in water than they can on land.

The water buoyancy also creates an environment that reduces the impact level on the joints and provides a gentler environment for children with unstable joints to exercise under a lighter weight-bearing condition.

Swimming has numerous benefits for children with cerebral palsy. Being in the water encourages children to move their limbs and experience the effect of their body movements. Warm water encourages stiff muscles to relax, and children move more easily in the water due to buoyancy.

Water play is a great opportunity for children to experience a variety of sensory feedback. For example, children experience the feel of the warm water, the sounds and sights of splashing, and the movement

of their limbs. Plus, perceptual and visual motor skills improve because water slows down movement and gives the child time to react and appreciate how to use their body.

Children will become more confident due to achievements made in the water. In addition, as children develop the ability to move and enjoy the water, children self-awareness and self-esteem will also improve.

The hydrotherapy pool's temperature is generally between 33-34°C. Warm water has a relaxing effect and can help decrease muscle tone. Cold water can increase muscle tone. Water kept at a constant temperature of 35°C is most suitable for a child with spasticity. A pool at about 33°C is suitable for children with low muscle tone. Look for a pool with a water temperature best suited to a child.

Benefits of Hydrotherapy

Hydrotherapy programs are used by physiotherapists to:

- increase gross motor coordination
- maintain or increase the range of movement and flexibility
- increase muscle strength
- improve balance and posture
- improve fitness and endurance
- promote breathing control
- promote water safety and awareness
- develop basic swimming skills

- reduce muscle spasms and encourage relaxation and enjoyment
- encourage normal movement patterns

Various swim rings, arm floaties, pool noodles and toys are incorporated into the hydrotherapy session to promote water independence and freedom of movement.

Among the activities children enjoy in a pool include acceptance of the water, its buoyancy, bubble-blowing and protection of the airway, kicking, splashing, floating, singing and playing.

Watsu technique

Watsu is a gentle form of body therapy performed in warm water (around 36°C). It combines the elements of massage, joint mobilisation, shiatsu, muscle stretching and dance. The receiver is continuously supported while being floated, cradled, rocked and stretched. The deeply relaxing effects of warm water, combined with Watsu's movements, stretches, massage and point work, would create a bodywork with many therapeutic benefits and potential healing on many levels.

Moments of stillness alternating with rhythmical flowing movements free the body in ways impossible on land. The warm water relaxes the muscles and supports the spine. With this support and without the body weight, the spine, joints and muscles can be manipulated and freed in a way unique to water work. The effects include very gentle yet deep stretching, a release of muscular and joint restrictions, and a state of deep relaxation, which encourages the release of stress and tensions.

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Background of Healing Garden

In the last two decades, gardens with therapeutic qualities have begun to appear in US and UK healthcare facilities. Now 'healing gardens' are being designed to support the treatment of patients with specific conditions. The idea that nature has a soothing, restorative effect is nothing new.

From medieval monastic infirmary gardens to the landscaped grounds of nineteenth-century mental asylums, enlightened carers have recognised that access to the outdoors has a salutary effect on a person's mental and physical health. However, with the onset of modern medicine and its emphasis on treatment via surgery and drugs, this knowledge was lost or deemed 'unscientific'. High-rise construction techniques created medical settings where patients were divorced from the outdoors. This is the common condition found in our medical institutions and care centers.

Thus in Wishesland Mini, our aim is not only to provide the medical settings and facilities, but also to engage the natural environment of the surroundings, where great natural healing energy forms, as the healing ground for our children and parents.

Masterplan and Design of Wishes Magick Garden

The landscape masterplan and details of the Wishes Magick Garden are designed by landscape architect L.A. Clarice Chiong Sik Ing from Earthscape Inhabitant S/B, a professional landscape architectural firm specializing in landscape planning and urban design.

Objectives of Wishes Magick Garden

The core objective of Wishes Magick Garden is to create an environment that stimulate and balance our children's physical, cognitive and emotional growth, as well as to provide a platform for them and their family members to interact and share their feelings, before or after children has gone through the various activities in the Centre.



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There are 3 zones in Wishes Magick Garden: namely Wishes Welcome and Social Zone, Wishes Sensory cum Play Zone and Wishes Meditation cum Aromatherapy Zone.

Wishes Welcoming and Social Zone

Extended from the building and overlooking to the gate and the main road, the existing open space is created into Wishes Welcoming and Social Zone. The paved area in circular layout is designed for group activities and gatherings, with the sculpture of Wishesland located in the middle as the focal point. The zone is designed with simplicity concept in mind and fulfills wheelchair accessibility requirements. Simple introduction of Wishesland and relevant information about CP will also be displayed here.

Wishes Sensory and Play Zone

In this physical active zone, we have introduced mud, lawn and sand areas for children to play as part of the sensory stimulation programmes. The garden also includes elements such as different walking surfaces for those learning to walk

with the aid of a walker or cane; differing planter heights for children learning fine motor control to sit or lean while doing simple gardening tasks; play structures that encourage and challenge the physical movement of the children.

Other outdoor facilities are slopes, steps, bridges, a range of walking surfaces and parallel bars to aid in physiotherapy. Plant labels that speech pathologists use in their work with children regarding speech training will also be introduced. We encouraged our parents to engage their children with lot of exercises in the garden as we believed through exercises, there are many beneficial effects on both physical and mental health growth of the children.

Wishes Meditation cum Aromatherapy Zone

There is evidence that the more social support a child receives from family and friends, the better he or she is able to heal. The garden is thus designed with a place where children and family members can converse in a calm and aesthetic setting. Specific planting design and park furniture in a semi-private setting will be designed for small groups of two to three family members to be together to share and care

for one another. There will be a series of beautiful and carefully selected sculptures with family-related theme displayed in the garden as well.

We encourage our parents and their children to explore the environment through their senses, as we believed that the lower of our rates of anxiety, the less we are aware of the pain experienced. The basics of Wishes Magick Garden design are related to the subject of stress relief, as the relief of stress among parents and children would help to bolster their immune system and stimulate the body's natural healing proclivity. Thus, the Wishes Magick Garden will provide a multi-sensory experience with colourful flowers, varying shades and textures of green, the sights and sounds of water, elements that attract birds and butterflies, fragrances, and ornamental plants which move with the slightest breeze.

What is Boccia?

It is called "Bocce Ball" in Taiwan, and is also translated as "Bocce Ball" in other Chinese-speaking regions. Bocce (BOCCIA) was originally a throwing game in ancient Greece. After correction, it became an activity that uses very few body movements but requires the use of strategies and skills. It is a competition designed for physically and mentally handicapped people with severe movement control difficulties.

In 1984, it listed as one of the Paralympic Games competitions; and in 1989, Cerebral Palsy International Sports and Recreation Association (CPISRA) was established. The meetings were held to discuss the competition rules and competition system. In 2013, Boccia International Sports Federation (BISFed) take over the matters related to cerebral palsy. In the past ten years, Boccia have been actively promoted all over the world, including the schools (special education schools), medical rehabilitation institutions, social welfare organization, and rehabilitation institutions for the physically and mentally handicapped people by combining the three major fields of medical care, education, and sports.

Besides cerebral palsy, the sport is expanded to other people with physical disabilities (muscle atrophy, spinal cord injury, rare diseases, etc.), mental disorders, visual impaired groups, and even senior citizen and children. We look forward to the sport becoming one of the national sports.

Boccia Rules and Regulations

1. The BOCCE court is a hard, flat ground of 6 meters X 12.5 meters.



Boccia Grading System

According to the contestants' muscle tension, coordination ability or muscle strength, they are divided into different groups to compete.

BC1 athletes have severe activity limitations affecting their legs, arms and trunk, and typically dependent on a powered wheelchair.

BC2 players have better trunk and arm function than those in class BC1. The abilities of their arms and hands often allow them to throw the ball overhead and underhand and with a variety of grasps.

Boccia Balls Box



- The game is divided into red and blue teams. Each team may be made up of one, two or three players, played individually, in pair or in team.
- The red team first throws the white target ball, and throws the first red ball.
- The blue team throws the first blue ball.
- The team that is further from the white target continues to throw the ball.
- The game ends when all colored balls are thrown.
- Scoring: The team that is closest to the white goal ball wins, every color ball that is closest to the opponent's target ball is counted as one point. (For example, if the red team wins, it is the red ball that is closer to the blue ball than the nearest target ball will receive points).
- End of a game (Four or six innings), the team with the higher accumulation points from each inning wins the game.

BC3 class athletes have significant limitations in arm and leg functions, and poor or no trunk control. They are unable to consistently grasp or release the ball and are unable to propel the ball consistently into the field of play and allowed to use a ramp with the help of a Sport Assistant.

BC4 class contains players with non-cerebral impairments that also impact their co-ordination.

BC5

- For conditions of both Cerebral and Non Cerebral origin
- Cerebral: Quadriplegic, Triplegic, Severe Hemiplegic.
- Non Cerebral: impairment may result from lack of muscle strength, limitation in range of movement or limb shortening.
- May use either a manual or power wheelchair
- May be able to walk with assistance or using a walking aid over short distances
- Has a more active throw as a result of increased trunk control and/or upper limb muscle strength
- BC5 athletes are not eligible for an on-court assistant.
- Or non-cerebral hemiplegic.
